

PREFACE

This Report provides estimates of the population of Turkish Cypriots and the number of settlers from Turkey in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus for the period 1974-1996.

It is based on the demographic analysis of the latest available data in the Department of Statistics and Research as at the end of 1996. The sources used are official data of the Republic of Cyprus, published data of the "authorities" in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey and information appearing in the Turkish Cypriot press.

It aims at presenting the demographic evidence available on the diminishing number of Turkish Cypriots and the increasing number of Turkish settlers in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus.

The Report was prepared by the staff of the Demographic and Social Statistics Division of the Department under the guidance of Mrs. I. Chappa, Head of the Division.

INTRODUCTORY NOTE

In this Report, any mention to any "authority" exercising power in the part of Cyprus which has been occupied militarily by Turkey since its invasion of Cyprus in July/August 1974 should be construed as reference to "authorities" established by Turkey as the Occupying Power. They are illegal in that they are contrary to:

- (a) the Treaties of 1960 establishing the Republic of Cyprus as well as to its Constitution.
- (b) International Law in general and especially to the four Geneva Conventions of 1949, and
- (c) the UN Security Council's Resolutions on Cyprus and especially to Resolutions 541 (1983) and 550 (1984) which deplored and condemned all Turkish secessionist actions in the occupied part of Cyprus and declared them illegal and invalid.

Also, in the text, the term "settlers" is employed to denote Turkish nationals who in violation of international legality as reflected in the U.N. Charter International Law and U.N. resolutions were transferred and implanted in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey in pursuance of its policy aimed to:

- (a) change the demography of the occupied part, and
- (b) create a majority of Turks from Turkey in that part.

The policy and practice is contrary, inter alia, to the Geneva Convention Relative to the Protection of Civilian Persons in Time of War, 1949, which in its article 49 stipulates that "the Occupying Power shall not deport or transfer part of its own civilian population into the territory it occupies".

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This Report provides estimates of the Turkish Cypriots and the number of settlers in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey. It is based on the demographic analysis of official data of the Republic of Cyprus and published data of the "authorities" in the occupied part, as well as information appearing in the Turkish Cypriot press.

Population figures and other demographic data on fertility, mortality and migration for the occupied part of Cyprus are presented and discussed.

Estimates of Turkish Cypriots are obtained on the basis of two projection scenarios. Both are based on the 1960 Census figures giving the population size, sex and age structure of Turkish Cypriots at the end of 1960.

In scenario A the projection assumes fertility and mortality of the Turkish Cypriots similar to the rest of the Cyprus population. With regard to migration assumptions, up to the middle of 1974 it was based on the stated intention of Turkish Cypriots on the departure cards of the Republic of Cyprus and from then onwards the net migration balance was taken as the balance of arrivals and departures of Turkish Cypriots as published by the "authorities" in the occupied part and reported in the Turkish Cypriot press. The result is an estimate of 89.200 Turkish Cypriots at the end of 1996.

In Scenario B the projection assumes from 1975 onwards fertility and mortality as published by the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area and corrected for underregistration. Migration assumptions are the same as in scenario A. The result is an estimate of 80.500 Turkish Cypriots at the end of 1996.

Having estimated the number of Turkish Cypriots using the two scenarios the number of settlers can be obtained by deducting the number of Turkish Cypriots from the population in the Turkish occupied areas as published in the various reports of the "authorities" in the occupied part of Cyprus. The result is 109.000 settlers in 1996 according to Scenario A and 117.700 according to scenario B.

Another method of estimation used is based on the net migration of Turkish nationals, as shown by the balance of arrivals and departures, and their natural increase. The number of settlers as the end of 1996 is thus estimated at 80.000 on the basis of the data up to 1994 and assuming no migration for 1995-1996.

The report concludes that because of the high emigration of Turkish Cypriots their number is diminishing. They constitute roughly half of the population in the Turkish occupied area. If we also include the Turkish occupying forces (around 35.000) then the Turkish Cypriot community is clearly a minority compared to the Turkish nationals in the occupied area of Cyprus.

Furthermore, their share to the total population of Cyprus (in which illegal settlers from Turkey are not included as they are not part of the Cyprus population) has diminished to a mere 12%.

This study attempts to estimate by demographic analysis the number of Turkish Cypriots and the number of settlers from Turkey in the period 1974-1996 on the basis of data available to the Department of Statistics and Research, data published in reports of the "authorities" in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey and information appearing in the Turkish Cypriot press. All available data have been compared and assessed; only those found consistent and reasonable have been used. This is an updated version of a previous study prepared in 1996.

2. Sources of statistical data

Though there are various sources of information and references as to the number of settlers, the approach used in this study to estimate the numbers of Turkish Cypriots and settlers was based on official data of the Republic of Cyprus and published data of the "authorities" in the occupied part of Cyprus.

The following sources of statistical data have been used:

- Census of Population and Agriculture 1960, Republic of Cyprus. (The Census was conducted by the Department of Statistics and Research in 1960 at a time when Turkish Cypriots participated in all organs of the Government; it was jointly conducted by Greek Cypriots and Turkish Cypriots).
- Annual Demographic Reports of the Department of Statistics and Research, Republic of Cyprus.
- "Demographic Report 1980" of the "Turkish Federated State of Kibris"
- "Statistical Yearbooks" for the years 1978-1981 of the "Turkish Federated State of Kibris"
- "Statistical Yearbooks" for the years 1982-1994 of the "Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus"
- Article in newspaper Yeniduzen of 15.2.89 presenting a table on arrivals and departures from data of the "General Directorate of Security Forces" of the "TRNC".
- Articles in newspaper Yeniduzen of 5.2.92 and 6.2.92 giving arrivals of tourists and total arrivals and departures.
- Article in newspaper Kibris of 29.11.93 giving arrivals and departures of Turks.
- Table in newspaper Yenicag of 27.12.93 for arrivals and departures up to 1992.
- Article in newspaper Kibris of 27.12.96 giving the Census results of 15 December 1996.
- "Tourism Statistics 1994" of the "Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus".

3. Population

The population of Turkish Cypriots for the years before the Turkish invasion of Cyprus in July/August 1974 and the total population of the Turkish occupied area, as published in the various reports of the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area, is presented in Table 1.

Except for the years for which population figures are given for a specific month, it is not clear whether the figures refer to the end of the year or the mid-year population or whether the "de jure" or the "de facto" concept is being used.

It is important to note that the data published by the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus on the number of Turkish Cypriots in 1972 and March 1975 are more or less in agreement with the estimates of the Department of Statistics and Research for about the same period (April 1973). According to the data of the Micro-Census of April 1973, census enumeration and estimates for Turkish Cypriot enclaves, the Turkish Cypriot population totalled 116.000. The mean annual rate of growth was calculated at 0,9% in the intercensal period 1960-1973. According to the population figures of the "authorities" in the area of Cyprus occupied by Turkey the mean annual rate of growth of the population is calculated at 0,7% for the period December 1960 - March 1975.

In fact comparing the number of Turkish Cypriot emigrants in the period 1961-1972, which amounted to 9.330 out of a total of 48.586 (a share of 19,2%), to that of the Greek Cypriots, it is evident that during this period Turkish Cypriot emigration was proportionately slightly higher than the corresponding Greek Cypriot emigration, taking into account the population size of the two communities. This could justify somewhat smaller growth rates of the Turkish Cypriot population which are in agreement with the population estimates of the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus for the year 1972 and March 1975.

It is obvious that the numerical increase of the population from one time period to the next and particularly during the period March 1975 - October 1975, October 1975-1976, 1976-1977, 1977-1978 and 1994-1996 as shown in Table 1 cannot be accounted for solely by the natural increase of the population, that is the difference between births and deaths, but indicates positive net migration balance of a large size. The same applies to the annual rate of population growth. Population growth rates of the order of 18,9%, 11,4%, 5,1%, 4,2%, 3,8%, 3,6% and 2,1% are indicative of the high migratory movements to Cyprus which are explained by the massive arrival of settlers.

On 15 December 1996 a Census of Population was conducted in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus. Provisional census figures have been published in the Turkish Cypriot press (Kibris of 27.12.1996) and put the enumerated population at 198.215 persons.

4. Fertility

Data on registered births appear in the Demographic Report 1980 as well as in the annual Statistical Yearbooks of the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area. The distribution of births by age of mother is also given and it is stated that about 95% of births are registered.

Based on the number of registered births which is taken to represent 95% of the total, the "true" number of births is estimated. Then the crude birth rate is calculated as well as the total fertility rate on the basis of births by age of mother. These figures are given in Table 2.

There is a downward trend in fertility during the period 1977-1994. The crude birth rate decreases gradually from 21,2 births per thousand population in 1977 to 13,9 in 1994. Similarly, the total period fertility rate decreases from 2,553 children per woman in 1979 to 1,610 in 1994. Already by 1982 the total fertility rate appears to have fallen below the 2,10 replacement level.

These figures are hard to believe; while the figures for the period 1977-1979 or even 1977-1981 seem reasonable, the sudden drop of fertility in the Turkish occupied area at this low level below replacement, already in 1982, is difficult to explain and accept.

What seems to be a reasonable explanation is that the completeness of birth registration is not constant at 95%, but has probably changed significantly. Particularly with the arrival of settlers from Turkey with a lower educational level than Turkish Cypriots, it is expected that the proportion of registered births must have decreased.

In the Demographic Report of 1980 the crude birth rate given for 1979 is 21 births per thousand population which corresponds to the level of the crude birth rate in the Government controlled area of Cyprus. Furthermore, Jones in his book on the Population of Cyprus comments that "Turkish fertility trends in Cyprus have been remarkably similar to those of the Greek Cypriots actually reaching the same low gross reproduction rate of 1,11 in 1978" (L.W. St. John-Jones, The Population of Cyprus, 1983, page 176).

It can be supported that the fertility of the Turkish Cypriots does not differ from the fertility in the Government controlled area of Cyprus. Also, for the period 1960-1972 the population growth rate as given by the "authorities" in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey implies a fertility level similar to the Greek Cypriot one.

The fertility of Turkish settlers is expected to be higher than that of the Turkish Cypriots and similar to the fertility of Turkey where the total fertility rate was 4,5 in 1975 and decreased gradually to 2,6 children per woman in 1995. (Council of Europe "Recent demographic developments in Europe, 1996).

In conclusion it can be put forward that the fertility data as published in the reports of the "authorities" in the occupied part are incomplete and that the fertility of Turkish Cypriots must not differ from the fertility in the Government controlled area of Cyprus.

An important piece of evidence of the existence of settlers in the Turkish occupied area is the fact that the Turkish Cypriots themselves published figures on registered births distinguishing between births to Turkish Cypriots and to Turks from Turkey, on the basis of the distribution of births by nationality of mother and father. This data were published only up-to 1982. Registered births of children with at least one parent from Turkey were around 36% in 1978-1979 decreasing gradually to 26% in 1982 and the corresponding births with both parents from Turkey around 22% and decreasing to 16%. These figures cannot represent the true share of settlers in the population of the Turkish occupied area, as birth registration is not complete, its degree of completeness may vary from year to year and it is expected to be much lower among settlers.

5. Mortality

Mortality data are more problematic than fertility data because the completeness of death registration is reported as only 25%. On the basis of registered deaths the "true" number of deaths has been calculated as well as the crude death rate (Table 3).

It is clear that this data cannot be realistic. The variation in the calculated crude death rate cannot be explained except by a varying registration completeness over the years. Thus, the reported constant 25% completeness of death registration is questionable. In the Demographic Report of 1980, the crude death rate given for 1979 is 10 per thousand population instead of 6,5 which is calculated for the same year in Table 3.

Mortality in the Turkish occupied area seems somewhat higher than in the Government controlled area. According to the life tables, life expectation at birth was in the Turkish occupied area 70,0 years for males and 72,0 for females in 1979 compared to 72,3 and 76,0 respectively in the Government controlled area in the period 1979-1981.

It is difficult to accept the mortality and life table data, because these are based on the experience of only one year and while only 241 deaths have been registered the life table presents 1485 deaths, a number presumably obtained on the assumption of a crude death rate of 10 per thousand population. It could be that the mortality of Turkish Cypriots is higher than the mortality in the Government controlled area.

On the other hand, it could also be supported that the mortality of Turkish Cypriots is the same as that of Greek Cypriots while the mortality of settlers from Turkey is much higher resulting in an increased mortality in the Turkish occupied area as a whole. It is noted here that the expectation of life at birth in Turkey was 65,7 years for males and 70,3 years for females in 1995. (Source: Council of Europe "Recent demographic developments in Europe", 1996).

6. Migration

In addition to fertility and mortality, migration plays an important role in population developments. In the period after the Turkish invasion there has been an important migratory flow of Turkish Cypriots out of Cyprus along with a larger flow of Turkish settlers from Turkey to Cyprus, as shown by the statistical data of the "authorities" in the occupied part of Cyprus (Table 4 and 4a).

Table 4 presents for the years 1974-1977 the data published in Yeniduzen which refer to data of the "General Directorate of Security Forces" of the "authorities" in the occupied area while for the years 1978-1990 the data are extracted from the Statistical Yearbooks. It should be stressed that for the years 1975-1977 the data, which were published in Yeniduzen and related to total arrivals and departures and their balance, are also given in the "Demographic Report 1980" of the "authorities" in the occupied area though without any analysis by nationality or country of usual residence. Also, for the years 1978-1986 the figures given in Yeniduzen do not differ much from the corresponding figures published in the Statistical Yearbooks. For the years 1991 and 1992 the figures given are those published in Yeniduzen, Kibris and Yenicag. For the years 1993 and 1994 the figures are from "Tourism Statistics 1994" of the "Turkish Republic of Northern Cyprus".

Table 4a is the same as Table 4 with some additional figures obtained on the assumption that the balance of "other tourists" in 1987 and 1991 for which data are not available is taken to be +370 based on their yearly average of the period 1974-1986, 1988-1990 and 1992.

Though the data of Tables 4 and 4a are not stated intentions of migration and refer to total arrivals and departures, their balance can be used to estimate the size of net migration. This is also done in the "Demographic Report 1980" where the balance of total arrivals and departures is given as net migration balance.

It is worth noting that during the period 1974-1994 there has been a negative net migration balance of Turkish Cypriots in the Turkish occupied area. Total departures of Turkish Cypriots from the Turkish occupied area to destinations abroad exceeded total arrivals by over 48.000 in the period 1974-1994. Along with this emigration a continuous and massive arrival of settlers is recorded. In the period 1974-1994 total arrivals of Turks from Turkey exceeded total departures by almost 58.000.

7. Comparison of population data with other demographic variables

Comparing the various demographic data published in the Statistical Yearbooks of the "authorities" in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey we find that these are not fully consistent.

Usually population data are based on Census results which are updated annually with data on births, deaths and migration. However, the population figures as published in the Statistical Yearbooks are not obtained from the population of the previous year with the addition of the natural increase and the net migration. It is noted, in this respect, that the population data are based on the Census results of 1978 which are projected at future dates using the statistical routines of FIV-FIV and SIN-SIN. This note appears in almost all Statistical Yearbooks. However the assumptions on which these population projections were based are not given.

It is noted here that this statistical package (which is also used by the Department of Statistics and Research for population projections) projects the population after five years from the base year using FIV-FIV and then SIN-SIN estimates the population at intermediate years using an interpolation technique. As a result it is not expected to have fully balancing population figures on a year by year basis.

For this reason the attempted comparison relates to the periods 1975-1978, 1978-1983, 1983-1988 and 1988-1993. Starting with 1978 which was a census year in the Turkish occupied area, the periods 1978-1983, 1983-1988 and 1988-1993 are 5-year periods. The implied natural increase of the population calculated from the population figures and the balance of total arrivals and departures is given in Table 5.

Though the annual rates of natural increase of 23 or 11 or 21 per thousand population could be regarded reasonable if taken one by one (since 21-23 is approximately the rate of natural increase of the population of Turkey, and about 11 is the rate of natural increase in the Government controlled area) they are not internally consistent if considered together, because the change from 23 to 11 and then to 21 is too abrupt to have been recorded in any population under normal conditions.

8. Estimate of the Turkish Cypriot population in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus

On the establishment of the Republic of Cyprus, the population of Cyprus totalled 573.566 according to the 1960 Census results. Classification by ethnic group gave 442.138 or 77,1% Greeks, 104.320 or 18,2% Turks and 27.108 or 4,7% others, mainly Armenians, Maronites, Latins and British. The Greek community comprising of Greek orthodox together with Armenians, Maronites and Latins, who have opted according to the 1960 constitution to belong to the Greek community, numbered 452.291 and the Moslem/Turkish community 104.942 giving a ratio of 4,3 of the Greek community to the Turkish community. In April 1973, according to the Micro-Census results the total population of Cyprus was 631.778 of which 498.511 belonged to the Greek community, 116.000 to the Turkish community and 17.267 others mainly British, with the ratio of the Greek community to the Turkish community remaining 4,3. By the end of 1996 the Greek community was estimated at 629.500 and the population in the Government controlled area 651.800.

In order to estimate the number of Turkish Cypriots who are now in the Turkish occupied area we have taken as base population the Turkish Cypriot population by age and sex as at December 1960 (Census figures) and we have projected the population at future dates on the basis of two different scenarios. The assumptions of each scenario on fertility, mortality and migration are summarised in Table 6.

The projection method used is the cohort-component method which projects the population by five-year age groups at five-year intervals of time, taking into account separate assumptions on the components of population change that is fertility, mortality and migration. Thus, on the basis of the population size and age structure of the Turkish Cypriots at the end of 1960 we can estimate what the population would have been in 1965, 1970, 1975 etc. until the end of 1995. Then by extrapolation population estimates for 1996 are obtained.

⁽¹⁾ Using as base population the Turkish Cypriot population by age and sex in 1960 as published in the Census of Population and Agriculture 1960 (Volume III, Table 4, page 9) the population of Turkish Cypriots was estimated at 116,000 in April 1973. The same estimate has been obtained making a projection with assumptions of fertility and mortality as actually recorded for the whole Cyprus population during that period and migration as actually recorded among Turkish Cypriots.

In scenario A, fertility and mortality are taken to be those actually recorded in the years before the Turkish invasion of July/August 1974 as well as after the invasion in the Government controlled area. It was, thus, assumed that during the 30-year period the natural increase of the Turkish Cypriot population was similar to the rest of the Cyprus population, an assumption which is supported by the data previously analysed. With regard to migration assumptions, negative net migration was assumed, taken from the stated intentions of Turkish Cypriots on the departure cards of the Republic of Cyprus up to the middle of 1974 and from then onwards the negative net migration balance as presented in Table 4a as the balance of Turkish Cypriot arrivals and departures. For 1995 for which there are no available migration data, it was assumed that the net migration balance was -2.400 following the diminishing trend of 1993-1994.

The results of the population projection according to scenario A are presented in Table 7. Total figures rounded in hundreds are given below.

The population of Turkish Cypriots has increased from 104.320 in December 1960 to 108.000 in the end of 1965 then to 113.500 in the end of 1970 and it is estimated that it reached 116.000 in April 1973. After the invasion as a result of the high emigration the Turkish Cypriot population decreased to 100.600 in the end of 1975. A gradual increase of the population followed until 1990 when the Turkish Cypriot population reached 109.400. In the subsequent few years heavy emigration resulted in an abrupt drop of the population which reached 90.000 in end 1995.

In scenario B the population of Turkish Cypriots was projected using again as base population the 1960 Census population and with same assumptions of fertility, mortality and migration up-to 1974 as those used in scenario A. From 1975 onwards the fertility levels were taken to correspond to those reported by the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area for the same period and corrected for under-registration. In the mortality assumptions, the expectation of life at birth was assumed to increase gradually each successive five-year period from the level reported by the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area for 1979. Migration assumptions are the same as in scenario A. Thus, this scenario differs from the previous scenario only in respect of the fertility and the mortality assumptions of the period after the Turkish invasion.

According to scenario B the population of Turkish Cypriots is estimated at 100.600 in 1975, 102.800 in 1980, 104.800 in 1985, 104.100 in 1990 and 81.900 in 1995. (Detailed results of the projection of the Turkish Cypriot population according to scenario B are presented in Table 8).

Estimates for 1996 are obtained by extrapolating the projection results by one year using the yearly number of births and deaths in the period 1990-1995 as obtained for each scenario and assuming a diminishing negative migration balance of -1700 for 1996 (Table 9). Thus, according to scenario A the population of Turkish Cypriots is estimated at 89.200 at the end of 1996, whereas according to scenario B it reaches only 80.500.

Scenarios A and B provide a reasonable range of the population development of the Turkish Cypriots which is estimated between 80.500 and 89.900 in 1996.

9. Estimate of the number of settlers

There are many pieces of demographic evidence, all reported in documents of the "authorities" in the part of Cyprus occupied by Turkey, which prove the existence of settlers in the Turkish occupied areas, such as the abrupt increase of the population much in excess of natural increase, births of children with both parents from Turkey, excess of almost 58,000 of arrivals of Turks over departures in the period 1974-1994, etc.

One method of estimation of the number of settlers can be based on the total population in the Turkish occupied area as reported by the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area and our estimates of the Turkish Cypriot population.

If we accept the provisional population figures as obtained from the most recent census of population and other figures published in the Statistical Yearbooks and other reports of the "authorities" in the Turkish occupied area, the population of the Turkish occupied area was 198.215 at the end of 1996. It is obvious that this figure includes Turkish Cypriots and Turkish settlers as well and since the population of Turkish Cypriots was estimated at 89.200 according to scenario A, then the number of settlers including their natural increase would be about 109.000 at the end of 1996. Similarly we can estimate the number of settlers in 1975, 1980, 1985 and 1990 at 26.800, 47.000, 53.800 and 62.100 respectively.

According to scenario B as regards the Turkish Cypriots and the population published in the reports of the "authorities" and press in the occupied area we estimate the numbers of settlers as: 26.800 for 1975, 46.800 for 1980, 55.500 for 1985, 67.400 for 1990 and 117.700 for 1996.

Another method which could also be used is based on the net migration of Turks as shown by the balance of arrivals and departures and their natural increase. At the end of each year the number of settlers is estimated by applying to the population of settlers at the end of the previous year their natural increase and adding the net migration of settlers due to arrival of new settlers (or subtracting when departures exceed arrivals). In this method it was assumed that net migration during the year does not contribute to the natural increase of that year.

Starting with 1.380 settlers at the end of 1974 the figure of 55.486 is reached at the end of 1985, 67.137 at the end of 1990 and 77.523 at the end of 1994. Even if it is assumed that there was no further arrival of Turks after 1994, since no data are available, the population of settlers would have been 78.748 at the end of 1995 and 79.992 at the end of 1996 (Table 10).

Comparing the various estimates of the number of settlers which are the result of different methods (Table 11), their number would be in 1996 109.000 according to scenario A, 117.700 according to scenario B and at least 80.000 on the basis of the net migration balance and its natural increase. Though these figures differ, their order of magnitude is the same giving a reasonable estimate of the number of settlers of around 109.000 in 1996.

10. Conclusion

The statistical evidence provided on the presence of Turkish settlers in the Turkish occupied area cannot be disputed, neither can the magnitude of the problem. What remains to be ascertained with accuracy is the growing number of settlers at a given point in time.

Also undisputed is the high emigration of Turkish Cypriots resulting in a diminishing number of the Turkish Cypriot community in the occupied area.

In this analysis it is shown that the Turkish Cypriot community constitutes less than half of the population in the Turkish occupied area. If we include also the Turkish occupying forces (around 35,000) then the Turkish Cypriot community is clearly a minority compared to the Turkish nationals in the Turkish occupied area of Cyprus.
